Information from the Director of Studies

Grading exam papers

Unfortunately some students have complained that written assignments have been assessed too late according to the guidelines set in the Examination Order. Since exams are upon us, I just want to remind everybody that a written exam paper must be assessed within four weeks from the date the students hand in their papers. The month of July is not included when calculating the four-week time limit. Under special circumstances, like illness, it can be arranged to extend the deadline, provided that the students are informed about the delay and the new deadline. Having a busy schedule or other commitments will NOT justify a postponement of the deadline.

For the Master's thesis, the assessment period at ARTS is set at 6 weeks. If a Master's thesis is submitted at the beginning of August and has been assessed before the end of September, this triggers a completion bonus of DKK 17,600, provided that the student has completed the degree program within the prescribed 2 years. It is really a shame for the department to miss this income if the grade is entered in the system on October, 1!

The progress reform – New consequences

With effect from 1 September, all students will be registered in courses for 30 ECTS each semester. The registration for mandatory courses can be done automatically, but if students have to choose between several elective courses, they must make an active choice.

After the deadline for registration 10 May, 8000 students at Arts had a deficit in their registration. Our colleagues in the study administrations have worked extremely hard to clean up the 8000 cases and get the students registered in the right courses.

In some cases, the students had actually left the program, but as long as they are registered at AU, they must be registered for courses. In several cases it turns out that the person was active in another educational institution, but just had forgotten to sign out of the University of Aarhus.

This is just one example of the many extra tasks for the administration, due to the study progress reform.

The teachers will especially feel the consequences at the exam table, where we can sit in vain, waiting for students, who were automatically registered for both ordinary and re-examination, but never show up.
